
Notice of Commencement under the Class EA for Waterpower Projects And

Notice of Public Information Meeting

Fletchers Horse Farm Archimedean Screw Micro Hydro-Electric Project

GreenBug Energ Inc. is undertaking an environmental evaluation and assessment to develop a 7.4 kilowatt (kW) waterpower facility at 2173 Cockshutt Road in Norfolk County. The project would consist of installing an Archimedean Screw power generating system in the remnants of an old mill beside an existing dam. If approved, this project would produce approximately 55,000 kWh of renewable energy annually. This project is subject to the Ontario Waterpower Association's "Class Environmental Assessment for Waterpower Projects".

The Class EA requires GreenBug Energy Inc. to undertake an evaluation of the project to evaluate its potential effects to the environment (positive and negative) and prepare a detailed Environmental Report. The project is also expected to require review and approval under the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act. This notice and the public consultation process under the Class EA is intended to coordinate and meet the notification requirements relevant to the planning stage of the project under these and other statutes. The evaluation and environmental report will assess the potential effects of the project on the environment during its construction and operation. Public consultation is an integral component of this process. You are invited to
